Celebrating 57 years 1955-2011

HALL OF FAME INDUCTEE - 2011



Thomas E. Hendershot was just seven when he took his first ride in a Piper J-3 Cub with Alice Gates, a well-known aviatrix. In his teens, he joined the Civil Air Patrol as a cadet and attended West Technical High School, where he specialized in Aviation. For more than half a century, he has been involved in the field of aviation beginning as a part-time Maintenance Apprentice for Sundorph Aeronautical Corporation (SAC) and joining the United States Air Force. In October of last year, Hendershot was inducted into the Colorado Aviation Hall of Fame.

From 1959-1963 Thomas Hendershot served in the US Air Force and worked his way

willoughby airport. Prior to his career at Air-Motive Specialties, he was a contract employee as a Line Pilot and Mechanic for Mohican Air Service, Ortner Air Service, Omni Air Service, Sundorph Aeronautical Corporation, and Firzgerald Air Ambulance. From 1967-1998 he served basically as Director of Operations/Compliance and Maintenance for Wright Airlines Inc. Corporate Wings, Inc. Mile High Aviation, Inc. Maintenance for Wright Airlines Inc., Corporate Wings, Inc., Mile High Aviation, Inc., Casper Air Service, and High Winds Aviation, Inc. In the late 1990s, he took a position with Frontier Airlines Inc. as a Quality Assurance Inspector, Maintenance Instructor, and Director of the AMT Program starting in 1999. Under his leadership, Frontier Airlines Inc. became the first FAR 121 certificated airline to receive the FAA Diamond of Excellence Award, and did so for nine consecutive years.

In January 2007, he assumed the role of Executive Director of AMTSociety. He currently serves on the boards of various industry associations including National Center for Aerospace & Transportation Technologies (NCATT), Aviation Technical Education Council (ATEC), National Business Aircraft Association (NBAA) Maintenance Committee, Redstone College, Northrop-Rice Foundation Executive Board (NRF), Joint Service Aviation Maintenance Technician Certification Council (JSAMTCC), Aviation Regulatory Advisory Council FAR 147, Chairman Emily Griffith Opportunity School for Aviation Denver Public Schools System, Chairman FAA/Industry General Aviation Awards Program Advisory Board, and Chairman of the FAA National Aviation Maintenance Technician of the Year Selection Committee, part of the General Aviation Awards Program.

His list of Achievement Awards is vast spanning many years throughout his career in aviation. Among them is the Haggan Aviation Diamond Award of Excellence 2005-2008, the Charles E. Taylor Master Mechanic Award 2005, the Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award 2005, Friend of FAA Award 2006, FAA Meritorious Achievement 2010, and the Colorado Historical Society Aviation Hall of Fame 2010. Among his affiliations are AMT Society, AOPA, Civil Air Patrol, Colorado Historical Society, National Association of Flight Instructors, Society of Aviation and Flight Educators and the Northrop Rice Foundation. Besides these, he is involved in many community service organizations.

Thomas Hendershot has logged over 25,000 flight hours in 125 different aircraft and recorded over 6000 hours as an instructor - all with 100 percent FAR safety compliance record. These significant accomplishments have required a steadfast commitment to safety and aviation skills.

Hendershot stated it is a tremendous honor to be inducted into the distinguished and prestigious OX5 Aviation Pioneers Hall of Fame along with the other individuals who have contributed and given so much to the aviation industry since 1903. "I have worked to improve the training, safety, and working conditions for our nation's air carrier maintenance technicians, and to provide much needed, otherwise unavailable, recurrent training for many of this country's general aviation mechanics. It is a true pleasure to have such a dedicated Board of Directors to work with and give back all we can to the aviation industry."

All financial reports are available upon written request.





EUNION MEMORI REUNION AT THE MUSEUM - HAMMONDSPORT, NY By Ivan D. Livi, National Secretary

There was crowd anticipation, silence, then a whirring sound followed by several short popping noises followed by the bellow of a ninety horse powered engine

speaking through short exhaust stacks. This was accompanied by the smooth, consistent roar of the whirling propeller. There seemed to be a crowd exhale of exhilaration as the OX5 engine performed like a present day, high technology machine. The running of the Curtiss OX5 engine was one of the highlights of the 56th Annual Reunion held at the Curtiss Museum, Hammondsport, N.Y.

The Curtiss OX5 engine was used in training airplanes during World War I. In the postwar period, its availability in quantity at low war surplus prices led to its adoption by many US manufacturers for their two- and three-place aircraft. The Laird Swallow was probably the first of these designs.

There were more than twenty airplanes powered by the OX5 engine. Among them were the Curtiss Robin, Travel Air 2000, Waco 9 and 10, American Eagle, Alexander Eaglerock, Pitcairn PA-4, and others.

The crowd of approximately sixty people watched the OX5 running exhibition outside of the facility of the Curtis Museum located in the rural area between Bath and Hammondsport, N.Y. The museum is a landmark of aviation history and has a magnificent collection of historical aircraft. Its restoration shop, under the supervision of Wing President Norman Brush, overhauls and rebuilds airplanes and engines.



A second highlight was the bus trip to the Corning Museum of Glass to see all forms of beautifully crafted glass articles and the methods used to manufacture them including the art of glass blowing.

The final highlight of the reunion was the Awards Ceremony Presentations. This was held during the banquet on the last evening of the reunion. 



Mort Brown, 103, quietly passed away in his sleep on Saturday, September 10, 2011. He was the first retired Chief Pilot of Production Flight Test, Cessna Aircraft Company, from 1937-1972. During his tenure, he was responsible for the release of 85,000 airplanes through Production Flight Test, of which he personally flew over 14,000 first flights, logging over 20,760 actual flight hours. His honors include the FAA Wright Brothers Master Pilot Award, Kansas Aviation Hall of Fame, and the OX5 Aviation Pioneers Legion of Honor and Hall of Fame.

(His wife, Sharon, donated a symbolic check for \$103.00 to OX5 in his memory)

Ronald began his aviation career with the U.S. Air Force, serving from 1951-1956. In 1956 he returned to Kansas and worked as a civilian maintaining heavy helicopters. In 1959 he received his FAA Mechanic's Certificate, and in 1963 he maintained and serviced America's Titan II Ballistic Missiles. In 1967 he started the Aviation maintenance program at the Vocational Technical School in Salina, Kansas, teaching full time and handling budget, procurements, and FAA certification of the program. When that program closed in 1981, he worked at the A&P School in Salina through

its many name changes and finally at Kansas State University-Salina. In 1996 he received the Kansas Governors Aviation Honor Award from the Kansas Aviation Hall of Fame for his many years of service and contribution to aviation history.

D. Berkeley Smith *February 14, 1908 – August 10, 2011*



Berkeley's life-long passion was aviation, after becoming interesting in flying by watching barnstormers over the Iowa cornfields. His first actual plane ride was in 1919. He started his flying at the Aero Corporation of California. He graduated from flying course, soloed in 1929 and received his private pilot license. He entered law school and graduated with a J.D. degree in 1936, but he continued to fly for the next 70+ years. In 2008, he was interviewed for the Timeless Voices of Aviation

Program as part of the Oshkosh AirVenture Museum. In 2010 he took his last left seat flight (at age 102) with an instructor copilot. Upon landing, he said, "When I get old, this will be one of my fondest memories." (Read more about him in the May 2011 OX5 News issue)


