LATROBE AIRPORT VISIT

On June 10, five Cliff Ball Wing members, Ivan Livi, Sherwood Thompson, Clifford Yerkey, Jim Kirk, and Dennis Yerkey, visited Latrobe Airport where they met with CBW member and airport manager Gabe Monzo. The purpose of the meeting was to discuss the relocation of OX5 memorabilia items, the OX5 display engine, and a propeller that was signed by CBW members. Included was a plaque with the names of CBW and Pennsylvania Wing members.

The memorabilia items were transported to Pittsburgh whereas the OX5 engine, propeller, and the above mentioned plaque were assigned to the newly opened KLBE Museum. CBW members were guided on a tour of the KLBE Museum by Sam Schrecengost, the curator. The museum facility is an exceptionally well maintained hangar that is sparkling clean, secure, and well organized. It is an excellent place for the display of the OX5 items.

In a subsequent discussion, airport manager Monzo revealed that the Airport Authority is going ahead with the erection of the previously planned museum and is actively engaged in the acquisition of the necessary funds. The CBW has committed to assisting with both of the museum projects.

The transfer of OX5-owned items to the KLBE Museum will be done under the terms of a Loan Agreement.

FLORIDA MID-WEST WING WELCOMES THE CBW





Lloyd C. Santmyer 1-2-1910 – 4-24-2010 CBW L-73 100 Years

Lloyd C. Santmyer, pioneer aviator, passed away Saturday, April 24, 2010 at his home in Ligonier at the age of 100. Lloyd was born in Mt. Pleasant, Pa January 2, 1910. His aviation career began at Charlie Carroll's Longview Flying Field in 1926 and over the following years his contributions to aviation

were so numerous and important that he was inducted into the Aviation Pioneers Hall of Fame in 1976. In addition to being a highly skilled flight instructor, he engaged in various experimental projects while a member of the Army Air Corp during World War II. He did the experimental flight tests on the "Instrument Landing System" that is used at airports worldwide today. He subsequently instructed airline and military pilots on how to use the system. At the Fighter Command school in Florida during World War II, he selected and trained the first night fighter squadron in instrument flying. Lloyd was then transferred to Wright Patterson field in Ohio to perfect glider and human ground to air pick-up techniques.

After World War II Lloyd returned to airmail pick up duty with All American Aviation. He became its training and civil aeronautics board check pilot for the Douglas DC3 when the company became All American Airlines. In 1951 Lloyd became the executive pilot for Allegheny Ludlum Steel Corp. During his ALS employment he flew then Senator John F. Kennedy on a number of his campaign trips in the ALS airplane before Kennedy became President. Lloyd retired from ALS in 1968 and spent his retirement years speaking at various aviation organizations, flying occasionally, and supplying information to aviation historians.

He provided much of the historic information to the St. Vincent College Center for Northern Appalachian Studies of Latrobe when it published "*A Place In The Sky*", a history of the local area aviation and its contributions to aviation's evolution from 1919 to 2001.

A copy of "A Place In The Sky" and a DVD of photos from Lloyd's collection will be given away at the 55th Reunion by the Cliff Ball Wing of Pittsburgh. A special thanks to his son, Carl L Santmyer of New Mexico, for background information and photos.


