The Taliban's suicide bomber yesterday exploded a car bomb in northern Afghanistan, killing eight Americans and wounding 22 others in what is the deadliest single attack on U.S. troops in Afghanistan since the Sept. 11 attacks. The bomber, who was not identified, targeted a U.S. military base in the region. The attack resulted in the deaths of eight Americans and wounded 22 others. The bomber was killed in the explosion.
