# Wilbur's Waco Restoration The Anna Project - It'll be done on Thursday!




The journey of the OX5 engine began with an innocent request from Captain Richard Wilbur; "Steve, I want you to build an engine for my Waco restoration."

### Fred's Engine As found In An Estate Garage




#### **Restoration - Continued**

I began my effort with a trip to the Seattle Museum of Flight and found an original Curtiss Standard Model OX5 Aeronautical Motor Parts List, 1917, Buffalo NY. The Parts List has been invaluable with identifying the parts and pieces of the 100-year-old engine. Next task became acquiring an engine(s). I had a professional colleague advise me that "... if you are building such a rare antique engine, you had better look for two of them to have enough parts to make up one complete engine". This advice has proven to be accurate. One engine we found through an Ohio estate auction, hence this engine was labeled "The Ohio Engine", A second engine was acquired after much sleuthing from the Oregon estate of Fred Van Abkoude; a complete Curtiss OX5 from the Hammondsport factory, christened "Fred's engine". Additional parts were purchased from helpful Club members and some eBay listings.




**Curtiss Data Plate Fred's Engine** 

It has now been five years since we took possession of the engines, parts. The first task was to disassemble, inspect and measure EVERYTHING. Aluminum cases were cleaned via an industrial chemical dip tank. The crankshafts were cleaned in an ultrasonic tank, automotive style dishwasher cabinet and a special built flushing tank with a pneumatic pump and a 4% NAOH (sodium hydroxide) solution.

#### **Restoration - Continued**

The camshaft journals were next on the priority list. The OX5 lubrication system is not a "priority lubrication system", in which oil is first fed to the crankshaft main bearings. The OX5 first delivers the lubricating oil to the camshaft and bearing journals and then the oil flows through case galleys to the crankshaft. This design necessitates a proper clearance (.0015") at the camshaft journals so oil pressure is not lost before reaching the high loads of the crankshaft main bearings. The camshaft was sent to a chrome plating firm and once a .010"-0.015" layer of chrome was electro-plated onto the journals, they were then precision ground to bearing clearance.

Eight rods and five main shells were re-babbitted at a firm outside of Kansas City with new babbitt/tin alloy and finished to bearing clearance dimensions. Also replaced were the connecting rod bolts and castle nuts as well as main cap nuts. (replacement rod bolt; Pioneer Bolt Supply CRB-300; Ford V-8 390 CID and 428 CID application.)

Connecting rods and camshaft were magnafluxed for cracks, none were found. The small end of the rod was fitted with a bronze bushing and honed to fit the wrist pins. Piston and rod assemblies need to be weighted and balanced to equal weights.

Future tasks include evaluating the cylinder condition. Valve train, guides and valve seats all need to be evaluated and re-conditioned. The exhaust seats are anticipated to be the major challenge ahead.

The ignition system has yet to be evaluated. What type of ignition to use has not been decided.

I am thankful that the Society of Automotive Engineers, (SAE) was founded in 1905, and screw thread standards were established prior to the 1917 manufacture of the OX5 engines. A 1931 edition of the SAE Handbook lists Curtiss Aeroplane and Motor Co. Engineers on Standard Committees. Most of the fastener threads are current sizes. There are a few exceptions I have found. These include a #14-24 tpi machine screw used on some case closures, and a ½"-24 tpi machine screw used on the oil pump mount.

# Wing Struts



**Kansas Wing:** Harold Walter included the following article in their March 2021 Kansas Wing OX5 News.

**U-CONTROL MODEL by Harold Walter:** When working at Convair San Diego the airplane Aero Group would get together and fly model airplanes on Saturday mornings, if work was not necessary. The meeting place was at Hour Glass Field. The field had been an emergency landing area for Miramar Naval Air station, and was located next to that airfield. It was no longer in use, and had plow "ditches" in order to prevent drag racing – an ideal place to fly models.

The models were built by individuals, and were generally experimental in nature. There were many configurations intended for exploring different ideas and modifications by the builder. Model types generally consisted of free-flight, U control and hand launch gliders.

One of my personal projects was to design and build a small U-control model and learn to fly it. When construction was finished, I could fly it easily. Next, our daughter, Sharon, learned to fly it. It was so tame that it would land itself. A symmetrical wing airfoil and a horizontal tail stabilator with an anti-servo tab were basic features.

It was very educational. I learned that the stabilator pivot point needed to be at or very near the quarter chord point of the stabilator, its Mean Aerodynamic Center. I've since been told about an airplane that had a small pitching oscillation, and have suggested that the pivot point be moved forward a small amount, based on my findings.

Several ideas were tested.. It was always interesting to see each person's product.

**Ohio Wing:** Jim Beisner reports to us with the following information regarding our past OX5 National Treasurer who flew west several years ago.

Just a note to let you know that the Ohio Wing has established a memorial fund in honor of Janet Barnard. It will be earmarked for the technology section of the Learning Center at the Waco Museum.
