

# Casey Fesperman 4/2/14 OX-5 interview by Janet Barnard at Sun 'n Fun

Casey Fesperman came to Sun 'n Fun OX-5 building from Anchorage, Alaska. Casey owned and operated one of the largest aerial photography businesses in the nation which had offices in Florida, Alaska, and Siberian. Russia. He has been involved in OX-5 for years and spoke about the OX-5 engines in Alaska. "Of course, the water-cooling portion of the OX-5 could be a problem in cold Alaska. The people up in Alaska would take out the water and replace it with kerosene. That would be a problem if it got too hot it would blow up like an A-bomb! One of his friends developed the Tank OX-5 engine. Tank took off the water jackets and replaced them with fins. The air-cooled OX-5 engine worked great."

#### Sir.

In volume 56 of the OX5 News there was an article on the Command Aire that stated Bob Lock had the only flying Command Aire. I am afraid that time has caught up with you, this is no longer correct. The Western Antique Airplane and Automobile Museum (WAAAM) in Hood River Oregon now has a flying Command Aire. The WAAAM Command Aire is a Bathtub Cockpit model 3C3-T. I am enclosing a photo of the airplane in flight over Hood River (note the OX5 engine) on 11 Aug 2013.



Our Command Aire was acquired by Terry Brandt from Art and Betsy Knowels for a donation to the museum. The restoration was completed by Tom Brown of Unity WI. The airplane arrived at the museum in the Fall of 2013.

WAAAM has seven flying airplanes powered by OX5 engines and additionally, currently has a Swallow undergoing restoration. I am assembling an OX5 engine for the Swallow. You are encouraged to visit the museum and see one of the best collection of flying airplanes that this writer has had the privilege to see.
