Large bands cut from an inner tube made a good shock cord.

Unbleached muslin was a good substitute for aircraft fabric.

The inner tube for the wheel of a model T-Ford was the right size to fit a DH wheel. Many of the OX-5 aircraft used these surplus wheels.

Forced landings were considered an integral part of flying and a necessary nuisance. I (John Cumberland) once had a forced landing on a farmer's field and walked over to the house where the family was having their noonday meal. The lord master looked at me and said "you are the third fellow to land in one of my fields and nobody has been has been kilt yet". I think he was disappointed.

But speaking of farmers, I don't think that I can ever remember a farmer or farm children being afraid to go up in an airplane. In fact, they always got such a kick at seeing the farm from the air, it was fun to take them up. Yours truly (John Cumberland) flew into Sky Harbor at the grand opening in 1928 in an OX-5 WACO 10.

Folded Wings

Ivan Livi, 94, of Pleasant Hills PA and former National OX5 Aviation Pioneer's Secretary, flies west on January 24, 2015.



Ivan Livi was employed by the Pittsburgh Institute of Aeronautics (PIA) for 42 years, assuming its presidency in 1978. During his 15 years at the helm, he took PIA to great success. During his tenure, the institution enjoyed its highest student enrollment of 1,200, the largest number of graduates, and during the peak of the aviation industry was considered the leading aviation school in the United States.

It was also during this time that PIA, on behalf of the OX5 Pioneers, restored the history-making airplane, "Miss Pittsburgh," that made the first airmail flight. That aircraft continues to proudly hang on display at the Pittsburgh International Airport.

He served on numerous boards and professional organizations including Aviation Technician Education Council, Professional Aviation Maintenance Association, Pennsylvania Association of Private School Administrators, OX5 Aviation Pioneers, Northrop Rice Foundation and the State Board of Private Licensed Schools.

He was celebrated as "Educator of the Year" by both the Aviation Technician Education Council and the Italian Heritage Society.

He was awarded the prestigious HALL OF FAME AWARD from the OX5 Aviation Pioneers, of which he was the National Secretary for 2 years.
